Playwrights' Notes

The Spinsters: Birth of a Too Tall Tale

Christine and Tara here – dynamic duo and chosen sisters! Our story began on the summer Fringe Festival circuit back in 2010, and ever since, we've been fans of each other's work. Fast forward to a warm summer evening in 2017 when Ian Walker, the mastermind behind The Spinsters' mechanical designs, threw out a gem: "You two tall ladies together make a stunning visual impact. How about gliding around a stage in giant, magical dresses? I could totally build them!" Well, needless to say, we were all in. But, wait, what's the story?

That brilliant idea marinated in the back of our minds until... cue dramatic music... the fall of the-year-that-shall-not-be-named (2020 – shh!). Picture this: a cabin in the mountains, a weekend getaway, bonding over our awkward youths. Too tall, awkward, no clothes fit — feeling more like "stepsister" material than "Cinderella" material. And it hit us - we were the Ugly Stepsisters.

This idea of flipping the script and exploring Cinderella's tale from the Ugly Stepsisters' perspective intrigued us. Where are they now? What's their deal? Were they really evil, vain, and vindictive? How did they become that way? Imagine them as middle-aged ladies navigating life's twists and turns. The questions were endless, and the answers, well, they got our creative juices flowing.

Thanks to our funders and a long list of supporters, we assembled our dream team of designers from across Western Canada to join us on a three-year rollercoaster of creation, research, and development. We've cooked up new techniques and gadgets, sprinkled in some magical realism, added scoops of raw ugliness, thrown in a gallon of shadow puppetry, and, voila, the modern Fairy Tale is restored to its original status of Cautionary Tale, albeit with a timely contemporary twist.

It's been one wild ride, and we can't wait for the conversations to follow.

Christine Lesiak (she/her) - co-creator/writer/performer - is an Edmonton/ Treaty 6 Territory based theatre artist, and co-founder of Small Matters Productions (est. 2007). She specializes in clown, devising, interactive performance, and physical storytelling. Christine holds a Masters of Fine Arts in Drama from the University of Alberta, a BSc in Physics. She is co-creator of and performer in Small Matters' nine full-length shows, including the multimedia spectacle, The Space Between Stars (2023, SkirtsAfire Mainstage), the interactive comedy hit, *For Science!* (2018-23). She is a puppeteer on the shadow puppetry films *The Wish/Le Voeu* (2021, Flying Canoë Volant Festival)

and *The Ride/Le Menege* (2022, Flying Canoë Volant Festival), and the Director of the Play the Fool, Western Canada's only festival of clown theatre and physical comedy. Watch for upcoming *The Lost Sock Rescue Society* at SkirtsAfire Festival 2024, and FOR SCIENCE! returns to the 2024 Edmonton Fringe. www.christinelesiak.com



Tara Travis ((she/her) - co-creator/writer/performer - is a third-generation settler on the unceded ancestral territory of the Coast Salish peoples, in particular the Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), Səlílwəta?/Selilwitulh (Tsleil-Waututh) and xʷməðkwəỷəm (Musqueam) Nations, colonially known as Vancouver. She is a theatre maker-actor-writer-puppeteer known for her prowess as a solo performer. Throughout her career, she has co-created and performed in over 30 original plays. She may be remembered for her work with Monster Theatre, notably Til Death: The Six Wives of Henry VIII and Who Killed Gertrude Crump? (nominated for 4 Jessie Richardson Theatre Awards,

including Best Actor, Female, also an audio play available at Monster Theatre: The Podcast). Her solo works include Fluffy 10th Street: Confessions of a Dirty Puppet, Lavinia: A Modern Fairy Tale of Gigantic Proportions, Searching for Dick: A Paranormal Comedy, and The Unfortunate Ruth. She's stoked to be returning to Edmonton Fringe this Summer with a ridiculous new Monster Theatre show, Erika the Red. www.taratravis.com



Jan Selman - (she/her) - director - is a theatre director, community arts animator, and professor at University of Alberta. She was the first Artistic Director of Catalyst Theatre and during those years the company grew from a part time, project-based organization to a year-round professional company creating 15 productions and community-based theatre projects per year. Recent work includes co-directing This is Canada (Ribbon Rouge ArtSpace Theatre, 2023) and Lwanda Magere, an award-winning adaptation of a traditional story with 25 Kenyan performers. Other recent work includes premieres of Meg Braem's Chrysothemis and Colleen Murphy's Bright Burning. Most recently she

directed a creation process with ArtSpace Theatre of the Nigerian tale Ogboingba Tries to Change Her Fate, which will premiere at KinFest, a new festival of African, Caribbean and Black artists in May 2024.



Ainsley Hillyard - choreographer - is an Amiskwacîwâskahikan (Edmonton)based artist of settler descent. She is a choreographer, performer and educator who works in contemporary dance and theatre. Her work is immersed in the curiosities and connections between these two forms. As an independent artist, Ainsley has worked with many theatre companies and received numerous Sterling nominations and awards for her performances and choreographies. Select choreography credits include; *The Sound of Music* (Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre/Citadel Theatre) *Deafy* by Chris Dodd (Citadel Theatre), *Almost a Full Moon* (Citadel Theatre). Movement Director for *Jane Evre* adapted

by Erin Shields (Citadel Theatre), *Mr. Burns: A post electric play*, (You are Here theatre and Blarney Productions), *Cardiac Shadow*, (Northern Light Theatre/Good Women Dance Collective) and assistant choreographer for *Hadestown* and *Peter Pan Goes Wrong* (Citadel Theatre).



Jeny Cassady - director of puppetry - Jeny received her classical theatre training at the University of Victoria and has worked in live theatre in Victoria, Calgary, and Vancouver. She has trained and experienced great success as a puppeteer in the film and television industry. Her work has been featured on stage at Axis Theatre, Chemainus Theatre, Bard on the Beach, and The Arts Club Theatre where she won a Jessie Theatre Award for her puppet direction in Hand To God, as well as on the web for Nokia, and in numerous independent films including the award winning feature hit Sunflower Hour. Jeny's puppet performances

span many styles of puppetry, and can be seen on film and television productions including The Barbarian and the Troll, Muppets Wizard of Oz, The Haunting Hour, Alien vs. Predator 2, Turner and Hooch, The Hole, Marmaduke, Fringe, Stargate SG-1, and Falling Skies among others.



Suzie Martin - dramaturg - Suzie Martin is the Artistic Director of Theatre Projects Manitoba. She is a member artist of Small Matters Productions, and director/dramaturg of their shows Over Her Dead Body and The Object of Constellations. She has been creating, directing, and teaching theatre for over a decade. She holds an MFA in Directing from the University of Alberta and a BA-Honours in Acting from the University of Winnipeg. Suzie directs and develops new work in a variety of styles including physical comedy without words, site-specific interactive installation, workshops and premieres of new scripted plays,

and collaborative devising processes. She also has a passion for interpreting pre-existing texts through production whether that be through adapting non-theatrical source material for the stage or an iconoclastic interpretation of a classic. She was nominated for a Sterling Award for Outstanding Direction for Fetch and holds a teaching award from the University of Alberta.



Kat Evans (she/her) – production manager/technical director/stage manager/lighting design adaptation - is an industry award nominated freelance professional Artist, Designer, Creator, Producer, PM/TD, Technician and Stage Manager based in Amiskwaciy-Wâskahikan (Edmonton, Alberta) on Treaty 6 Territory, Metis Regional Council 4. She holds a BFA in Theatre Design from the University of Alberta, and is the Co-Founder of The October People Productions. Wardrobe Styling and Creative Direction. He has been privileged to work in Dance, Theatre and Film; most notably Ballet BC, Tony n' Tina's Wedding, Leo Awarding Winning "Looking Back" and as the personal Costume Designer for Tara Travis. Ian Walker - mechanical and structural designer/set & props/special effects - is an innovative theatre collaborator, problem solver, and professional engineer and mechanical designer with over 30 years experience in metal and structural design. He is co-creator and performer in Small Matters' For Science! (2018-24), and a designer and filmmaker in the shadow puppetry work The Wish/Le Voeu (2021, Flying Canoë Volant Festival) and The Ride/Le Menege (2022, Flying Canoë Volant Festival). He is a filmmaker and film editor.



Dusty Hagerüd - lead puppet, wig and make-up designer and builder - Dusty Hagerud originates from Fernie, B.C. and is a member of the Ktunaxa/Kinbasket people of the Lower East Kootenays. Creative Director and founder of Color Sound Lab Puppet Makers, Dusty has been performing and designing in Puppetry for 20 years in Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver working with the Red Smarteez, Carnival Sized Cinnamon Hearts Marionette Troupe, Moth Orbit Object Theatre, Flying Pig Puppet Co., Skelemo Productions, The Odd-Lot Puppet Company, Axis Theatre, Monster Theatre, Anachronism Pictures,

The Field Productions, Joi Productions, Blatant Studios, Serscha Studios/Oats Productions, Dim Mak Records, UBC Medical - Education Media, Artaban Productions, Spotted Fawn Productions, CBC, Telus Communications, and Nickelodeon TV.



Steven Snider (he/him) - puppet designer and builder - Steven is an Arts programmer & activator. He works with Color Sound Lab, assisting in puppet design & fabrication for theatre, film, television & video. His passion for the Arts has led to 14 years with the West Vancouver Community Arts Council, connecting community through the Arts. A lifetime lover of the fantastical & absurd, Steven is at home in the exciting world of puppetry.



Nico Weismiller - (he/they) – lighting designer - is a Vancouver based designer and technical wizard. Painting with light, Nico tends to combine the surreal and the realistic to create engaging environments for each new show. There's always at least one hidden aspect used in a show to uplift the story, even if you don't notice it at the forefront of your mind while watching. After the last couple years with theatre being locked down, it's been tricky to create art. As a result it's extremely exciting to be a part of the creation process of a show again and to be working with a wonderful team. Recent credits for Nico

include: Men Express Their Feelings; Dissection of a Mixed Heritage Woman; The Wolves; Love/Sick; Deep Into Darkness; and Dry Land.



Michael Caron - composer/sound designer - has been working as a sound designer, audio engineer and composer for theatre, art installation and live performance since 1995. With a passion for collaborative theatre, he has a focus on site specific work and the use of interactive audio and sensor technology to activate non-traditional performance spaces.
